

## UWC Australia Patronage

The roles and levels of commitment for each type of Patron are described below.

### Indigenous Patron

#### **Definition of role**

The patron will be actively involved with fund raising activities and will report directly to the Board of Directors. They will be required to raise awareness for the global UWC movement, as well as encourage donations at the national level for an Indigenous Scholarship.

This person will be well connected with people from within the Indigenous community. The patron will be charismatic and engaging. They will require good PR skills and will possibly come from a community leadership/education background. They will use their contacts to approach communities to encourage young Indigenous Australians to apply for a UWC scholarship.

Financial contribution is not a requirement for this role.

#### **Level of commitment: High (active)**

The patron will be involved in fund raising activities and maintaining networks. They must invest a significant amount of time towards this role (TBD).

#### **Persons of interest**

The patron will be well connected with access to educational resources and Indigenous Communities.

Possible patrons can be approached with expressions of interest and invited to attend selections and/or other activities, in order to gain an understanding of our operations before being invited to fulfill the role.

## Honorary Patron

### **Definition of role**

This person is a patron in name only. They lend their moral support to UWC Australia but are otherwise not actively involved with any of UWC Australia's activities.

### **Level of commitment: none (passive)**

### **Persons of Interest**

The Patron will be well known to the public.
